



FALL 2016 PAPER SHREDDING DAYS

For Burlington County Residents with ID (no businesses or non-profits). **9am to 1pm on the following SUNDAYS:**

September 25 | October 23 | December 4

County Resource Recovery (Landfill) Complex

You can bring confidential documents only (bank, credit card and tax statements). **Do not bring** junk mail, catalogs or other common mailings. **Limit 4 boxes per car. Volunteers will help unload cars. You may bring shredded paper to these events!**

A NECESSARY CHANGE – **STOP RECYCLING SHREDDED PAPER**

With "in-home" paper shredding on the rise, the problem of shredded paper in single stream recycling plants has gotten worse. Whether loose or bagged, the shred spills like confetti onto conveyors and clogs machinery. The result – most shred just contaminates our recycled glass or ends up as residue.



DO NOT RECYCLE SHREDDED PAPER AT THE CURB AND LOCAL DROPOFFS.

For residents who do want to recycle shredded paper:

- Bring it to our FREE Paper Shredding Days
- Bring it to a special shredded paper dropoff at the County Resource Recovery Complex in Mansfield (Monday – Friday 7am-4:30pm; Saturday 7-11:30 am)

Smart Tips to **RECYCLE RIGHT**

- Put recycling curbside by 6 am
- NO plastic bags or plastic wrap
- Empty and flatten boxes
- Rinse containers clean before recycling
- **You can screw caps back on empty lightweight bottles,** like water bottles

RECYCLING WORKS, WHEN WE RECYCLE RIGHT.

NO pots and pans, propane tanks, batteries, light bulbs, wire hangers, plastic bags, and medical syringes. **These damage equipment and put our workers at risk.** Follow the guidelines on the back of this flyer.

BURLINGTON COUNTY RECYCLING GUIDELINES FOR HOMES WITH CURBSIDE RECYCLING

RECYCLE:



Make sure metal bar faces the street.

Paper and Cardboard



Plastic Bottles and Food Containers

Including berry boxes and yogurt cups.



Glass Bottles and Jars

Labels are okay!



Metal Cans ONLY

Other metal items jam and damage sorting equipment. Attached metal lids are okay!



Cartons



EMPTY & FLATTEN BOXES | EMPTY AND RINSE CONTAINERS

DO NOT RECYCLE:

NO PLASTIC BAGS

They jam our sorting equipment! Recycle at grocery stores.



(like Styrofoam).

NO plastic wrap or newspaper sleeves.

NO plastic plant pots, pill bottles, or flat plastic (like trays and lids).

NO loose caps or any hot or cold drinking cups/straws.



NO hardback books, food soiled, or frozen food boxes.

NO aluminum foil or trays.

NO bulbs, glassware, or window glass.

NO motor oil, paint, pesticide containers, or propane tanks.

NO batteries.
