REDEVELOPMENT

Rt. 73 South Redevelopment Area- Update

Mr. Gural reported ongoing negotiations with Fair Share Housing. Mr. Rosenberg reported he will keep Borough Council informed on the negotiations with Fair Share Housing but he is optimistic for a favorable outcome.

Mr. Rosenberg further reported the Environmental Justice lawsuit litigation filed by the New Jersey Attorney General at the request of the governor to remediate the toxic waste facility at Fillit was scheduled for dismissal by the judge.

Mr. Brewer reported PURE, LLC is proceeding with the amended site plan approvals and will be heard later this month at the Land Use Board Meeting.

Outlaw Training & Fitness/620-622 Highland Ave Redevelopment Project — Update

Mr. Brewer stated a case management meeting was held today with Active Realty; he noted the trial is scheduled for a June 14 thru 16. 2022 for the valuation of the property.

Mr. Brewer further reported Outlaw Fitness and Training submitted plans for approval to go before the Land Use Board for site plan approval. Mr. Brewer noted approval was granted and the application can go before the Land Use Board.

Sea Box/ELM Office LLC, 321 E. Broad Street - Former Knights of Columbus Property- Update Mr. Gural reported there was no updated information. Mr. Gural further reported Seabox was invited to the Borough to discuss their plans for the property and he is awaiting a reply.

Arbor Day Proclamation 2022

Whereas, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees, and

Whereas, this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska, and

Whereas, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world, and

Whereas, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce life-giving oxygen, and provide habitat for wildlife, and

Whereas, trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires and countless other wood products, and

Whereas, trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community, and

Whereas, trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal.

Whereas, the Borough of Palmyra has been recognized as a Tree City USA 16th year by the National Arbor Day Foundation and desires to continue its tree-planting practices

Now, Therefore, I Gina Ragomo Tait, Mayor of the Borough of Palmyra, urge all citizens to celebrate Arbor Day and to support efforts to protect our trees and woodlands, and

Mayor Tait asked for a motion to open to the Public for comments Mr. Allmond made a motion to open the public portion for comments. Dr. Cloud second the motion.

All members present voted in favor of the motion. Motion Carried

Mayor Tait asked if any comments were received before the meeting. Municipal Clerk, Ms. Jackson indicated no comments were received prior to the meeting.

Mayor Tait asked if there were any comments from the public

Ms. Kelly - Highland Ave — Ms. Kelly spoke on behalf of several residents in reference to the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commissions experimental pop-ups program which assists communities with the installation on temporary low-cost changes to roadways, to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety. Ms. Kelly noted the pop-up projects could potentially last anywhere from one day up to three weeks, and after the demonstration a survey would be taken to see if the project would be viable permanently. Ms. Kelly noted she wanted to invite a member of Borough Council and or the Land Use Board to a webinar on April 20^{th,} 2022 at 11:00 am which further explains the program, Dr. Cloud stated she would be able to attend. Ms. Kelly also asked if the Borough has some sort of pedestrian or bicycle plan. Mayor Tait stated there was a survey done several years ago which refers to pedestrian or bicycle safety. Mr. Gural confirmed the Borough's 2018 Master Plan update addresses pedestrian and bicycle safety and is available on the Borough's website.

Mr. Casparro – Riverton resident Park Ave. – Mr. Casparro noted he had emailed the governing body regarding a clean-up of Broad Street for the upcoming Palmyra Safety Day. Mr. Casparro stated the PIA wanted to weed and clean up the trash on Broad Street, this Saturday so it would look good before Palmyra Safety Day. Mr. Casparro noted the PIA will leave the trash bags by the trash cans to be removed by Public Works on Monday. Mayor and council agreed.

Mayor Tait asked Mr. Casparro if the flower pots were taken to Charles Street School. Mr. Casparro indicated they were donating them but not transporting them. He indicated he told Charles Street school will reach out to the Borough about the pots. Mayor Tait indicated she had not heard from anyone. Mr. Casparro indicated he would look into it and get back to her.

Hearing no one else from the public wishing to be heard, Mayor Tait asked for a motion to close the Public Portion. Mr. Allmond made a motion to close the public portion, Dr. Cloud second the motion.

Mr. Gural reported there are several amendments to the Personal Policy and Procedure manual referencing bereavement, requiring credit checks on new hires who handle money, and the COVID 19 policy that will be discussed at the May meeting.
